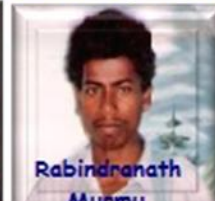

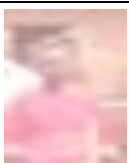

SOCIO-ECONOMIC CONDITION OF THE REFERENCE AREA:

The socio- economic condition of the reference area is in bleak. Contradictory envy with social alienation is one of the most dreadful equipments. Social alienation is isolation from the society, which is nothing but single kind of swaggering unfriendliness or revengeful misdeeds with people living around. People do not get the help or advice or co-operation of theirs' neighbors at the time of essential emergency need.

\Rather many escaped communities function by offering lame excuses. However, unfortunately at the time of destructive sequence some bully type groups unmask theirs' tooth and nail desperately.

They prefer love- knot unite with the social miscreants, Does repeated violence attack throwing bricks- stones for forcible collection of Tola or subscription or illegal demand of high posting service job in our social welfare organization so on and so forth. At present situation, the deadly disease of social alienation has turned up such a low infectious level that even if one tries to help someone else, it is looked down upon with suspicion. As the tremendous consequences, it increases the high risk of psychotic illness in the society. Innocent huge children are brought up, as the future generation of our nation, in such an environment that tends to develop a sense of apathy towards neighboring people around them.

PROBLEMS IDENTIFIED IN THE REFERENCE AREA:

- a. Harmful effect of Environmental Pollution and Global Warming.

- g. Unbearable burden of Increasing rate of seasonal or permanent migration for lacking offamily asset, alternative resource, or occupational convenience
- h. Destruction of traditional livelihood as the whole region is high proficient in draught.
- i. More acute crisis of safe drinking water as dwindling water resources
- j. Population explosion but sardines like inhabitation.
- k. Unscientific, unhygienic sanitation
- l. Narrow fanatic agitation
- m. Limitless addiction to alcohol
- n. Infection of Jaundice, TB, Tumors, HIV, Lungs, and Kidney- Heart failure like dangerous diseases
- o. Political wrangle

ACTIVITIES

AMBASSADORS ORPHANAGES:

Children are often helpless victims of poverty and disaster and yet they will be the ones to shape the future. Our mission is to provide Shelter with all daily needs and education for orphans and vulnerable children.

Our Two Orphanages:

We are pleased to present an overview of the activities and support received from the **CSR Team of DMI Finance Private Limited**. Their generous contributions have played a vital role in sustaining and improving the quality of life for the children in our care. The support extended to both our orphanages where at present girls 138 and boys 68 covered a wide range of essential needs, as detailed below:

1. **Food Support:**

Nutritious meals were provided to all children, ensuring their healthy growth and development.



- Emergencies meals provided to more than 200 children in time of crisis.
- Special food kits were distributed during festivals and emergencies.
- Emphasis on balanced diets for children.

2. **Healthcare:**

Medical check-ups, medicines, emergency treatments, and hygiene items were made available to ensure the physical and mental well-being of the children.

3. **Electricity Expenses for Daily Operations:**

CSR support helped in covering electricity bills, ensuring uninterrupted power supply for lighting, fans, water pumps, and other essential appliances.

4. **Cooking Fuel:**

The cost of LPG and other cooking fuels was covered, supporting the preparation of meals in a safe and efficient manner.

5. **Education:**

School fees, stationery, uniforms, and tuition support were provided, helping the children to continue their studies without interruption.



6. Human Resources:

Salaries and honorariums for caregivers, teachers, cooks, and housekeeping staff were supported, ensuring smooth day-to-day functioning of the orphanages.

7. Miscellaneous Costs:

Additional operational costs such as maintenance, transportation, and minor infrastructure improvements were also supported under this CSR initiative.

All the children they are enjoying with daily activities as studies, playing, games, gardening spending time each other. Annually they do cultural activities and observing important days as Republic day, Independent Day, Rabindra Joyinti, Christmas Day, Birthday

In these very valuable services, many are knocking in our door to get waiting to get chances, as they are deprived, abandoned & destitute. **CRECHE -**

"CHILDREN ARE THE FUTURE FATHER OF A NATION"

The full form of **CRECHE** is **Children Rural for Early Care of Health and Education**. It is a high voltage humanitarian social welfare project specially healing up the deprived children directly sponsored by the Government under ICDS supervision.

Three such CRECHES centers have been running steadily under monitoring of AMBASSADORS SERVICE SOCIETY at three different locations.

UNITS of the CRECHES

1. The first unit is **at PatharHuri Village, Ps - Keshiary**
2. The second unit was at **Tilaboni** (Mahisamura) village, PS - Keshiary and
3. The third unit is **at Birkard (Bahurupa) Village, PS - Narayangarah.**

Each Centre One **CRECHE MOTHERS** and One helper are dedicating their motherly care and guiding service in each **CRECHE CENTRE**.

CAPACITY/ STRENGTH - Total 75 underprivileged rural children under age group 6(six) years are the beneficiaries in the three such CRECHE UNITS. Maximum mothers are laboring. Maximum children are malnourished, malnutrition, uncared and unprotected from **ST, OBC and MINORITY** communities' illiterate, half-literate, superstitious families.

ACTIVITIES - Different childlike attractive activities with song, dance, music, playing, rhymes recitation, drawing, playing with magic kits, sporting kits, acknowledgement of pictures with different animals, birds, trees, fruits, flowers and natural things, Bengali and English Alphabet identification for those little babies physical, mental, spiritual and socio- emotional nourishment.

DIETS - Well balanced nutritious dry foods like Cake, Boiled or germ Gram, Boiled egg, Horlicks+ Biscuits and seasonal fresh fruits, Lunch providing Rice, dal & carry/hotchpotch strictly maintaining the daily diet chart despondently.

MEDICAL CHECK UP - Medical checkup camp for CRECHE children is a routine work in each quarter Year (Within three months) in each CRECHE CENTRE. It has been generally organized & checked by Physician.

MOTHER'/PARENT' MEETING - In a year two time mothers' meeting conducted regularly in each CRECHE CENTRE. Different essential objects are discussed in such meetings like health, hygienic, food, cleanliness, proper method of care and guide, regular attendance, prevention of infectious diseases cholera, Jaundice, typhoid, Malaria avoiding with drunkenness and superstitions.

SUCCESS - about 27 successful little learners from the three such CRECHE CENTRES got admission into 1st Standard in different Primary schools being well efficient in different subjects in the previous academic session.

**FARMING & CULTIVATION:**

Teenager are getting skill in agriculture & Farming in our own Mission compound, whatever the income out of cultivation it has applied in our daily food of our Orphanages. We salute the teenager and team of their willingness of learning.

**CULTURAL PROGRAMS & SPORTS:**

In Local Police administration, they have provided candy, cakes and other things to our children. Moreover, they have respected the Leaders in Christmas day. Thank those respected people who have counted our children whom we have been taking care.



We have conducted cultural program with sports in December. More than 100 children participated, 100 other people and 60 youth participated in this Nobel activities. The Parents and communities were involved in those programs. Program with Cultural dances, Drama, Jocks, Songs etc. In Christmas time, make fun, and distributed Cloths, food item to the neighbors. It is time to make friendship, having together food, cake cutting, and fun with the children. The Christmas Father was making fun, which called Santa.

INDEPENDENCE DAY & REPUBLIC DAY CEREMONY:

In 15th August Independence Day and 26th January is Republic Day. We conducted debate, some social programs. Generally, food items were distributed to all the participants.



Impact-Independence day program was participated all children, staffs was taken to procession around the area. After come back from procession national flag was hosted in different development centers.
